#### Dear President Ransdell:

This refers to the NRC approval of use of your Kentucky license to perform research and development activities with the Pelan neutron generator tube containing 3 curies of tritium at the Thunder Mountain Evaluation Center, Fort Huachuca, Arizona during the period of December 2 through 8, 2001. Enclosed is a copy of the of the NRC Form 241, Report of Proposed Activities in Non-Agreement States, Areas of Exclusive Federal Jurisdiction, or Offshore Waters which was submitted by Ms. Mary J. Reynolds, your Radiation Safety Officer, on November 27, 2001 (Enclosure 1). The NRC Form 241 was reviewed and approved by Mr. David J. Collins, of my staff on that same day.

The Commission grants reciprocal recognition of Agreement State licenses according to 10 CFR 150.20 (Enclosure 2). As described in this part of the regulations, any person who holds a specific license from an Agreement State, and who meets the conditions of this part, may be granted a general license to conduct the same activity where NRC maintains jurisdiction. The Agreement State licensee must submit and receive approval of the NRC Form 241 to conduct licensed activities under the general license. As part of the approval process, the reviewer considers issues addressed in the Agreement State license such as authorized users, locations of use and authorized uses and materials. The reviewer must conclude that the use described in the NRC Form 241 protects the public health and safety before the general license is granted.

The general license granted under 10 CFR 150.20 requires, in part, that the licensee comply with all terms and conditions of the specific license issued by an Agreement State except such terms or conditions as are contrary to the requirements of 10 CFR 150.20. Subsequent to our November 27, 2001, approval of the NRC Form 241, we learned that the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Cabinet for Health Services, Radiation Health and Toxic Agents Branch issued a Cease and Desist Order to Western Kentucky University (WKU) dated November 9, 2001. The Order stated that WKU must immediately cease all activities involving the use of neutron generators and must physically secure all radioactive material in the physics department pending a full investigation of the unauthorized location of use incident that occurred on November 2, 2001. In addition, all personnel involved with the incident were suspended from use of radioactive material under any license in the Commonwealth of Kentucky pending the investigation. Based on the requirements of the Order, you are no longer authorized by your Agreement State license to use the neutron generator tubes and therefore cannot use the device under reciprocity in NRC jurisdiction.

Once you have resolved the issues associated with the Order and the Commonwealth of Kentucky authorizes WKU to use the neutron generator tubes, you may submit an amendment to your NRC Form 241 for any changes such as locations and dates of use. Fort Huachuca, the proposed location of use on the November 27, 2001, NRC Form 241, and the Commonwealth of Kentucky have been provided a copy of this letter and the enclosures.

In response to your Notice of Violation dated November 13, 2001, we are submitting the following response for your review.

The Radiation Safety Officer, Mary J. Reynolds, seized and secured all radioactive material from the Dept. of Physics and Astronomy the afternoon of November 9, 2001, as the Cease and Desist Order (dated Nov. 9, 2001) submitted by the State dictated. The material (including all neutron generators) is currently stored in a locked cage in Thompson Complex-Center Wing Room 27.

The Radiation Safety Committee, chaired by Dr. Gene Tice, has met on four (4) separate occasions regarding the events that occurred on November 6, 2001. The initial two times (Nov. 15 and Nov. 19) were held to interview participants of the November 6 event and gather facts. The last two meetings (Nov. 29 and Nov. 30) were held to make decisions about what steps need to be taken. The Nov. 30 meeting was the meeting where there was a call to motion, a second, and a unanimous vote in favor of the following decisions:

- Remove Drs. Douglas Humphrey and George Vourvopoulos from WKU Radioactive Materials License #203-017-83. This shall be for a period of six months from date of State's approval of the response to the Notice of Violation, after which they may reapply for Responsible Investigator under the License.
- 2) WKU President shall submit a letter informing all Responsible Investigators, including API staff, that the Radiation Safety Officer and Radiation Safety Committee is in charge of the Radiation Safety Program and License issues,

- the RSO is the only contact for all radiological/license issues with the State, and that the RSO must be informed of all radiological issues.
- Produce and implement a Radiation Work Permit for non-routine work conducted under WKU's radioactive materials license. This work permit shall include, but is not limited to, information on users, procedures, dates for use, etc. There shall also be a required submittal lead-time that allows for review of the RSO and the RSC. The State Cabinet for Health Services may be contacted prior to approval of the Radiation Work Permits for discussion.
- 4) Have all API Responsible Investigators submit all procedures/protocols, etc. for approval by the RSO and RSC for approval to work with the relevant radioactive materials/radiation-producing equipment.
- Amend license to split the neutron generators/Pelan from the same item addressing other gauges. The usage of neutron generators/Pelan will require RSO and RSC approval with the Radiation Work Permit previously addressed.
- 6) Increase number and thoroughness of unannounced internal audits at API facilities, with the RSO and RSC jointly conducting the first audit, at a minimum.
- 7) These corrective actions shall be sent to the State in a response to our Notice of Violation, and shall be signed by the President of the University, the Chair of the Radiation Safety Committee, and the Radiation Safety Officer.

Applied Physics Institute will continue work after the Radiation Safety Committee's approval of their procedures. All Responsible Investigators have the responsibility of ensuring that radioactive materials are used in accordance with the WKU Radiation Safety Manual, the Radioactive Materials License, and all pertinent regulations, including 902 KAR 100.

An amendment request to our current RAM license shall be forthcoming, projected to be sent to you prior to our holiday break, which begins December 19.

We are also revising our Radiation Safety Manual. We plan to add issues that specifically address reciprocity, violations, etc., and to scrutinize/further define the role of the RSO and RSC. We also plan to add a Radiation Work Permit to our program, with guidelines to completion of the form, which shall be included in the manual. We are also making it mandatory that the RI must read the manual, and sign and send the signature page to the RSO prior to working with radioactive material under our license. Our projected date for finalizing the revision to the manual is February 22, 2002.

For clarification on API facilities/personnel:

- These facilities are non-academic, in that there are no classes, strictly research and development;
- These are the only facilities that use the neutron generators:
- The personnel at these facilities are all personnel in the Department of Physics and Astronomy; however, only a few of these personnel teach.

It is the intent of Western Kentucky University to fully comply with our license and State regulations, and to maintain a strong radiation safety program. I hope that we have addressed all the issues in the Notice of Violation to your satisfaction. Should you need further information, please let me know.


