Dear Congresswoman Kelly:

I am responding to your letter of June 14, 2000, in which you request that I, as Chairman of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ensure that the safety of the public is not jeopardized by resuming the operation of Indian Point Nuclear Generating Unit No. 2 Further, you request that the Commission, rather than the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation, determine whether to allow Consolidated Edison (Confed) to restart the plant, using the existing steam generators. You based this request on a series of developments, listed in your letter, which followed the February 15, 2000, incident of a steam generator tube failure.

Although public health and safety have been maintained, the NRC shares your concern about events at the plant and recognizes the importance of our continued close attention to Conted's corrective actions for performance problems. The NRC staff is conducting a comprehensive review of Conted's proposal to allow plant startup and operation for a limited period using the existing steam generators. As you are aware, in accordance with its operating license, Conted must obtain NRC's approval before plant startup and operation with the existing steam generators.

NRC staff from the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation and NRC Region I have been closely following CovEd's steam generator inspections since shortly after the February 2000 event.

This activity also includes a detailed review of inspection data and results as they relate to

steam generator tube integrity. The staff is continuing inspections to ensure that all appropriate corrective actions will be completed before restart. NRC approval of future operation of the plant with the existing steam generators will not occur unless we conclude that these generators meet technical standards, and, therefore, pose no undue risk to public health and safety.

The staff has kept and will continue to keep the Commission informed of its review activities, including those you have listed in your letter, related to the restart of ndian Point Unit 2. The Commission recognizes the level of detail of the staff's review of Correct proposal and believes that the staff is taking appropriate actions to ensure that the health and safety of the public will continue to be maintained.
