The second iscue was not directly related to Indian Point 2 and involved a recently iscued NRC Inspector General (OIG) audit report, "Special Evaluation of the Role and Structure of NRC's As you are aware, Executive Council:" The OIG report on the NRC's Executive Council (EC) concluded that alternative management strategies pertaining to the E6 should be considered to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of agency operations. The staff's actions to meet NRC's called into guestion responsibilities to protect health and safety of the public were not at issue in the report. The Commission believes that its mandated health and safety responsibilities are being successfully -strongly Furthermore, I assure you that the Commission will ensure that its decisions related to the EC will not detract from stuff activities associated with oversight of Indian Point 2. T strongly fulfilled. With regard to potential changes as a result of the OIG's special evaluation of the EG Commission is currently reviewing this report to determine whether changes are warranted would not expect that changes involving the EC would have a negative impact on activities The Commission is Carefully considering the OIG's conclusions to determine what, if any, changes are warranted. I will keep you informed of the Commission's decisions this important matter. However, I believe it is important to reiterate that organizational
