Subject: Re: Diablo Canyon

Mrs. Beckers,

You are correct, starting Monday March 25, Steve Baggett (SLB@nrc.gov) will assume the project manager duties for the Diablo Canyon ISFSI. Steve O' Conner (SCO@nrc.gov) will assume project management responsibility for SONGS. They are both project managers in the Spent Fuel Project Office. Please contact them directly, I am transferring out of the Spent Fuel Project Office.

1. At this time there are no additional public meetings planned for San Luis Obispo County regarding the Diablo Canyon ISFSI. A public meeting was held last year in preparation for NRC receiving the application. However, as you know, there will be an opportunity for you to request a hearing. The Federal Register Notice announcing your opportunity for a hearing should be issued within the next month. Mr. Baggett will have this responsibility.

2. NRC has obtained the appropriate expertise to review the seismic issues for the Diablo Canyon ISFSI. As I've stated earlier, all information that PG&E submits regarding the Diablo Canyon ISFSI may be obtained through the NRC Public Document Room. You may contact the PDR technical reference librarians by:

You have been added, as the representative for Mothers for Peace, to the Spent Fuel Project Office mailing list for all NRC generated documents.

3. All PG&E and NRC generated documents regarding the ISFSI application will be made publicly available (see No. 2 above).

4. Storing spent fuel at SONGS using a general license is a legal option that Southern California Edison has. I attempted to respond to your questions regarding the general license for SONGS by sending you the Information book on dry cask storage. If that did not adequately answer your question, please restate your question based on what information in the book is not clear and we will try to assist you on this matter.

5. If you are not able to obtain all of the documents that you feel you need through the methods described in No. 2 above, submitting a FOIA is another method to obtain documents regarding the Diablo ISFSI.

I hope this answers your questions.

SONGS. Please advise of person who will be in charge and job title.

Also I have received Application, EIS and Safety Analysis from PG&E, thanks for your help.

Several questions I addressed to you were only partially answered or not answered at all, so I will repeat.

1. Timeframe of public meetings on radioactive storage in San Luis Obispo.

2. While I appreciate that the NRC will review seismic data developed by PG&E, I wonder who the independent seismic experts are that will be reviewing this for the NRC. In addition, the San Luis Obispo Mothers for Peace request the same information be cc: to our organization. Should we request this of PG&E or the NRC?

3. In addition we requested copies of all audit finding and nonconformance repts as well as all paper-work generated by the project. Again should this request be made of PG&E or the NRC and how soon can we expect arrival of this material.

4. Questions on Generic license for SONGS were not addressed

I brought this information to the attention of our Congressional representative's staff and he said we should file a FOIA. If this is the avenue the NRC chooses to have us follow, please let us know ASAP.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation and I hope prompt response.
