Under this program, those licensees who desire to participate may be granted up to five personnel security clearances for access to classified information to key licensee staff at each nuclear power reactor site. Two-unit and three-unit sites should be treated as one location for these purposes. The Facility Security Officer for each site must be included as one of the five persons cleared. Classified information will eventually be disseminated to these licensee contacts through the NRC resident inspector office, which will be provided the ability to receive and store classified national security information.

Individuals must agree to execute the SF-312, "Classified Information Nondisclosure Agreement" (enclosed), before the clearance is granted. Individual clearances must be updated every 10 years. Licensees will be expected to cover the initial and recurring costs of the individual clearances. which will be \$145.00 each. In order for the NRC to make a Facility Security Clearance determination, participating licensees will also be required to develop a security plan as a user of classified information (Standard Practice Procedures Plan enclosed) and be subject to Foreign Ownership Control or Influence (FOCI) determinations made by the NRC. An overview of these requirements can be found in Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations (10 CFR) Part 95. A sample FOCI package including Form SF 328, "Certificate Pertaining To Foreign Interests." is also enclosed.
