The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment Nos. 28 and 26 to Facility License Nos. DPR-29 and DPR-30, respectively, for the Quad Cities Station, Units 1 and 2. These amendments are in response to your request dated September 17, 1975.

These amendments modify the technical specification requirements for certain environmental sample locations, frequencies and monitoring instruments used for determining the presence of radioisotopes in the environment in the vicinity of the Quad Cities Nuclear Power Station. The changes consist of elimination of certain monitoring instruments or samples which have proved of limited value and the addition of other instruments and sample types which provide better indication of environmental conditions.

We have evaluated the potential for environmental impact of plant operation in accordance with the enclosed amendments. The amendments apply to sampling locations and sampling frequencies. We have determined that the amendments do not authorize a change in effluent types or total amounts nor an increase in power level, and will not result in any significant environmental impact. Having made this determination, we have further concluded that the amendments involve an action which is insignificant from the standpoint of environmental impact and pursuant to 10 CFR \$51.5(d)(4) that an environmental statement, negative declaration or environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with the issuance of these amendments.

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Since the amendments apply only to the environmental sampling locations and to sampling frequencies, they do not involve significant new safety information of a type not considered by a previous Commission safety review of the facility. They do not involve a significant increase in the probability or consequences of an accident, do not involve a significant decrease in a safety margin, and therefore do not involve a significant hazards consideration. We have also concluded that there is reasonable assurance that the health and safety of the public will not be endangered by this action.



Pursuant to 10 CFR 50.59, Commonwealth Edison Company requests amendments to facility licenses DPR-29 and DPR-30. The purpose of the amendments is to update Appendix A, Table 4.8.1, Environmental Sampling. The enclosed amendments are included on pages 186 through 191.

The proposed changes include:

- 1. Eliminate ion chambers because of many factors which limit their usefulness as a dosimeter. TLD's will be used to monitor environmental gamma radiation.
- 2. Eliminate annual TLD because of fading. Quarterly TLD's perform the same function.
- 3. Change collection point of milk to milk producers within ten miles of the plant to avoid changes to license as producers change.
- 4. Change well water collection point to four (4) wells within several miles of the plant to avoid changes to license as owners change.
- Coverage and crud sensitivity of the program.
- 6. Make vegetable collection points less specific in order to permit a wider choice of vegetable. Some farms specified are either out of business or do not produce vegetables on a regular basis.

- 7. Eliminate from Pool 14 water fowl whose migratory habits diminish their usefulness.
- 8. Add new item, rabbits, because they provide a good indication of local accumulation of radioactivity.
- 9. Delete gross alpha special analysis because of the absence of alpha nuclides in airborne and liquid effluents other than in small quantities.
- 10. Change collection frequency of periphyton from quarterly to semi-annually because experience has shown it to be unavailable in cold months.
- 11. Change planned collection frequency for vegetables from three times annually to annually so collections coincide with the availability of vegetables during growing season.
