NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT TO FACILITY
OPERATING LICENSE

Notice is hereby given that the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. 17 to Facility Operating License No. DPR-30, issued to the Commonwealth Edison Company (acting for itself and on behalf of the Iowa-Illinois Gas and Electric Company), which revised Technical Specifications for operation of the Quad Cities Station Unit 2 (the facility) located in Rock Island County, Illinois. The amendment is effective as of its date of issuance.

This amendment authorizes Commonwealth Edison to carry out work that has the potential to partially drain the reactor vessel with the suppression pool water volume less than 112,200 ft³, provided that a total of 112,200 ft³ of water is available for cooling, including the quantity of water contained in the refueling cavity and the spent fuel pool above the bottom of the spent fuel pool gate.

The application for the amendment complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in the license amendment. Prior public notice of this amendment is not required since the amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration. For further details with respect to this action, see (1) the application for amendment dated October 15, 1975, (2) Amendment No. 17 to License No. DPR-30, with Change No. 31, and (3) the Commission's concurrently issued related Safety Evaluation. All of these items are available for public inspection at the Commission's Public Document Room, 1717 H Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. and at the Moline Public Library, 504 17th Street, Moline, Illinois 60625. A single copy of items (2) and (3) may be obtained upon request addressed to the U. S.
