In Reference 1, AmerGen Energy Company (AmerGen), LLC submitted a request for NRC review and approval of changes in the Clinton Power Station (CPS) emergency action level (EAL) classification schemes. This initial submittal was subsequently supplemented by References 2 and 3. Reference 4 provided a response to a request for additional information in support of the NRC's review of the AmerGen request. The NRC, in a conference call, requested follow-up information concerning the review of the proposed EAL classification schemes by the local governmental agencies.

The Illinois Department of Nuclear Safety (IDNS) provides a technical review of the EALs and, as documented in Reference 1, IDNS found the proposed changes to be acceptable. DeWitt County Emergency Services and Disaster Agency (ESDA) is the local agency responsible for emergency planning in the majority of the 10-mile emergency planning zone (EPZ) around CPS. As documented in Reference 4, DeWitt County ESDA has delegated their review of the EALs to IDNS. AmerGen has confirmed with DeWitt County ESDA that they are satisfied with the review performed by the State of Illinois and do not intend to perform any additional reviews of the proposed EALs.
