APPLICANT: Florida Power and Light Company (FPL)

FACILITIES: Turkey Point Nuclear Plant, Units 3 and 4

SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF APRIL 10, 2002, MEETING WITH FPL TO DISCUSS STATION BLACKOUT EMERGING ISSUE AT IT RELATES TO THE SCOPING OF ELECTRICAL AND STRUCTURAL COMPONENTS FOR THE TURKEY POINT UNITS 3 AND 4, LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION

On April 10, 2002, representatives of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff met with members of the Florida Power and Light Company (FPL) to discuss the impact of the staff's position on Station Blackout (SBO), as summarized in the staff's letter of April 1, 2002, to the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI) and to Mr. David Lochbaum of the Union of Concerned Scientists. In this letter the staff stated that, pursuant to the requirements of 10 CFR 54.4(a)(3) and 10 CFR 50.63(a)(1), it considered the portion of the offsite power system should be included within the scope of license renewal. Attached is a list of participants at the meeting.

The purpose of the meeting was to allow discussion and provide further clarification of the staff's position on SBO, as its relates to the identification of structures, systems and components (SSC) within the scope of license renewal for the Turkey Point license renewal application. During the meeting the NRC provided its regulatory and technical basis for concluding that additional structures and components should be added to the scope of the Turkey Point license renewal application as consistent with the staff's position on SBO and the requirements of 10 CFR 54.4(a)(3) and 10 CFR 50.63(a)(1). During the meeting FPL informed the staff that it would submit a letter to the NRC Document Control Desk that provides the additional structures and components to be brought within the scope of license renewal in compliance with the requirements of 10 CFR 54.4(a)(3) and 10 CFR 50.63(a)(1), identifies which of these additional components would require aging management reviews (AMRs), and lists the AMR results for those additional structures and components brought within the scope of license renewal. FPL also informed the staff that the letter would include FPL's bases for including or omitting a given offsite component within the scope of license renewal, consistent with the requirements of 10 CFR 54.4(a)(3) and 10 CFR 50.63(a)(1), and for concluding

whether the additional components brought within the scope of license renewal would require AMRs.
