The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 14 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-3 for the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 1, in response to your submittal dated June 5, 1978, as revised September 20, 1978, November 10, 1978, December 26, 1978, January 12, 1979, February 22, 1979, and March 16, 1979.

The amendment modifies the license to include the current Commission-approved physical security plan. This has been discussed with and agreed to by your staff.

We have completed our review and evaluation of your physical security plan as revised, and have concluded that the physical security plan for your facility, when fully implemented, will provide the protection needed to meet the general performance requirements of 10 CFR 73.55(a) and the objectives of the specific requirements of 10 CFR 73.55, paragraphs (b) through (h), without impairing your ability to safely operate your facility. We therefore further conclude that the plan as revised is acceptable.

The enclosed Security Plan Evaluation Report (SPER) represents our evaluation and acceptance of your physical security plan as revised. The SPER is being withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.790(d).

Changes which would not decrease the effectiveness of your approved security plan may be made without approval by the Commission pursuant to the authority of 10 CFR 50.54(p). A report containing a description of each change shall be furnished to the Director, Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation, U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, D. C. 20555, with a copy to the appropriate NRC Regional Office within two

months after the change is made. Records of changes made without Commission approval shall be maintained for a period of two years from the date of the change.

We have evaluated the potential for environmental impact of plant operation in accordance with the enclosed amendment. We have determined that the amendment does not authorize a change in effluent types or total amounts nor an increase in power level, and will not result in any significant environmental impact. Having made this determination, we have further concluded that the amendment involves an action which is insignificant from the standpoint of environmental impact and pursuant to 10 CFR §51.5(d)(4) that an environmental impact statement or negative declaration and environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with the issuance of this amendment.

The amendment does not involve significant new safety information of a type not considered by a previous Commission safety review of the facility. It does not involve a significant increase in the probability or consequences of an accident, does not involve a significant decrease in a safety margin, and therefore does not involve a significant hazards consideration. We have also concluded that there is reasonable assurance that the health and safety of the public will not be endangered by this action.




1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:
 - A. The filing by The Toledo Edison Company and The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company (the licensees) dated June 5, 1978, as revised September 20, 1978, November 10, 1978, December 26, 1978, January 12, 1979, February 22, 1979 and March 10, 1979, complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
 - B. The facility will operate in conformity with the licensees' filings, the provisions of the Act, and the rules and regulations of the Commission;
 - C. There is reasonable assurance (i) that the activities authorized by this amendment can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public, and (ii) that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations;
 - D. The issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public;
and
 - E. The issuance of this amendment is in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51 of the Commission's regulations and all applicable requirements have been satisfied.

2. Accordingly, Facility Operating License No. NPF-3 is hereby amended by revising paragraph 2.D. in its entirety to read as follows:

2.D. Toledo Edison Company shall maintain in effect and fully implement all provisions of the Commission-approved physical security plan, including amendments and changes made pursuant to the authority of 10 CFR 50.54(p). The approved security plan consists of documents, withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.790(d), referred to as the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 1, Industrial Security Plan dated June 5, 1978, with revisions dated September 20, 1978, November 10, 1978, December 26, 1978, January 12, 1979, February 22, 1979 and March 16, 1979.

3. This license amendment is effective as of the date of its issuance.

NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT TO FACILITY
OPERATING LICENSE

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. 14 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-3, issued to The Toledo Edison Company and The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company (the licensees), which revised the license for operation of the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 1 (the facility), located in Ottawa County, Ohio. The amendment is effective as of its date of issuance.

The amendment modifies the license to include the current Commission-approved physical security plan.

The licensees' filings comply with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in the license amendment. Prior public notice of this amendment was not required since the amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration.

The Commission has determined that the issuance of this amendment will not result in any significant environmental impact and that pursuant to 10 CFR §51.5(d)(4) an environmental impact statement or negative declaration and environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with issuance of this amendment.

The licensees' filing dated June 5, 1978, revised September 20, 1978, November 10, 1978, December 26, 1978, January 12, 1979, February 22, 1979 and March 10, 1979, and the Commission's Security Plan Evaluation Report are being withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.790(d). The withheld information is subject to disclosure in accordance with the provisions of 10 CFR §9.12.
