Dear Mr. Crouse:

The Commission has issued the enclosed Amendment No.56 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-3 for the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 1, in response to your submittal of August 15, 1979, and revisions dated November 24, 1980, and April 16, 1982.

The amendment modifies the license to include a requirement to maintain a Guard Training and Qualification Plan to be followed in accordance with 10 CFR 73.55(b)(4) within 60 days of this approval. All security personnel shall be qualified within two years of this approval.

We have completed our review and evaluation of your Guard Training and Qualification Plan and have determined that the plan for your facility, when fully implemented, will satisfy the specific requirements of 10 CFR 73.55(b)(4) and the general criteria of Appendix B to 10 CFR 73. We, therefore, conclude that your Guard Training and Qualification Plan is acceptable.

Changes which would not decrease the safeguards effectiveness of your approved Guard Training and Qualification Plan may be made without approval by the Commission, A report containing a description of each change shall be furnished to the Director, Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, D.C. 20555, with a copy to the appropriate NRC Regional Office within two months after the change is made. Records of changes made without Commission approval shall be maintained for a period of two years from the date of the change.

The amendment applies to the Guard Training and Qualification Plan and, therefore, does not authorize a change in effluent types or total amounts nor an increase in power level, and will not result in any significant environmental impact. Having made this determination, we have further concluded that the amendment involves an action which is insignificant from the standpoint of environmental impact

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and pursuant to 10 CFR 51.5(d)(4) that an environmental impact statement, or negative declaration and environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with the issuance of the amendment.

This amendment does not involve a significant increase in the probability or consequences of an accident previously evaluated, does not create the possibility of an accident of a type different from any evaluated previously, does not involve a significant reduction in a margin of safety and therefore does not involve a significant hazards consideration. We have also concluded that there is reasonable assurance that the health and safety of the public will not be endangered by this action, that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations, and that the issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public.

Your Guard Training and Qualification Plan and related materials consist of Safeguards Information required to be protected from unauthorized disclosure in accordance with the provisions of 10 CFR 73.21.

A copy of the Notice of Issuance is also enclosed.

AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:
 - A. The filing (which is being handled by the Commission as an application) by The Toledo Edison Company and The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company (the licensees) dated August 15, 1979, as revised November 24, 1980, and April 16, 1982, complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act) and the Commission's rules and regulations set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I; .
 - B. The facility will operate in conformity with the application, the provisions of the Act, and the rules and regulations of the Commission;
 - C. There is reasonable assurance (i) that the activities authorized by this amendment can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public, and (ii) that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations;
 - D. The issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public; and
 - E. The issuance of this amendment is in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51 of the Commission's regulations and all applicable requirements have been satisfied.

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2. Accordingly, Facility Operating License No. NPF-3 is hereby amended by revising and reformatting paragraphs 2.D.(1) and 2.D.(2) and adding paragraph 2.D.(3) to read as follows:


2.D Physical Protection

Toledo Edison Company shall fully implement and maintain in effect all provisions of the following Commission-approved documents, including amendments and changes made pursuant to the authority of 10 CFR 50.54(p). These approved documents consists of Safeguards Information required to be protected from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 73.21:

- (1) Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 1, Industrial Security Plan dated June 5, 1978, with revisions dated September 20, 1978, November 10, 1978, December 26, 1978, January 12, 1979, February 22, 1979, and March 16, 1979.
- (2) Davis-Besse Safeguards Contingency Plan dated June 2, 1980, submitted pursuant to 73.40. The Contingency Plan shall be fully implemented, in accordance with 10 CFR 73.40(b).
- (3) "Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station, Unit 1, Industrial Security Plan, Appendix B, Security Training and Qualification Plan" dated November 24, 1980, as revised April 16, 1982. This plan shall be followed in accordance with 10 CFR 73.55(b)(4), 60 days after approval by the Commission. All security personnel, as required in the above plans, shall be qualified within two years of this approval. Toledo Edison Company may make changes to this plan without prior Commission approval if the changes do not decrease the safeguards effectiveness of the plan. Toledo Edison Company shall maintain records of and submit reports concerning such changes in the same manner as required for changes made to the Security Plan and Safeguards Contingency Plan pursuant to 10 CFR 50.54(p).

3. This license amendment is effective as of the date of its issuance.

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. 56 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-3, issued to The Toledo Edison Company and The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company (the licensees), which revised the license for operation of the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 1 (the facility) located in Ottawa County, Ohio. The amendment is effective as of its date of issuance and is to be fully implemented within 60 days of Commission approval in accordance with the provisions of 10 CFR 73.55(b)(4).

This amendment adds a license condition to include the Commission-approved Guard Training and Qualification Plan as part of the license.

The licensees' filing, which has been handled by the Commission as an application, complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's rules and regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's rules and regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in the license amendment. Prior public notice of this amendment was not required since the amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration.

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
