The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) is considering issuance of an exemption from the requirements of Appendix R to 10 CFR Part 50 in response to a request filed by Toledo Edison Company, The Cleveland Electric Illuminating Company, and Centerior Service Company (the licensees), for operation of the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 1 (DBNPS), located in Ottawa County, Ohio.

ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

Identification of Proposed Action

The proposed exemption would allow redundant trains of safe shutdown circuits in the containment annulus to not be separated by a 3-hour rated fire barrier.

The proposed action is in accordance with the licensee's application for exemption dated May 18, 1990.

The Need for the Proposed Action

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The containment annulus is an approximately 4.5-foot-wide space between the shield building and the containment vessel which extends completely around and above the containment vessel. Cables and piping pass through the annulus on their way from the auxiliary building to equipment inside the containment vessel. Modification of the current annulus fire protection features would result in considerable expenditure of engineering, construction, and plant staff resources for its installation, maintenance, and surveillance. Environmental Impacts of the Proposed Action

The licensee has provided justification for the exemption demonstrating that the existing fire protection features for the containment annulus provide an equivalent level of protection from a fire. On this basis, there are no changes in the manner of the plant operation in the event of a fire. Therefore, there will be no increase in either the probability or the amount of radiological release from the Davis-Besse plant in the event of a fire.

Accordingly, the NRC staff concludes that this proposed action would result in no significant radiological environmental impact.

With regard to potential nonradiological impacts, the proposed exemption will not cause significant increase in the nonradiological impacts and will not change any conclusions reached by the NRC staff in the "Final Environmental Statement for the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station, Unit No. 1" dated March 1973 and its supplement dated October 1975. Therefore, the NRC staff concludes that there are no significant nonradiological environmental impacts associated with the proposed exemption.

Alternative to the Proposed Action

Because the Commission's staff has concluded that there are no significant environmental impacts associated with the proposed action, any alternatives would have either no significantly different environmental impact or greater environmental impact.

The principal alternative would be to deny the requested exemption. This would not reduce environmental impacts as a result of plant operations.

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Alternative Use of Resources

This action does not involve the use of any resources not previously considered in the "Final Environmental Statement for the Davis-Besse Nuclear Power Station, Unit 1" dated March 1973 and its supplement dated October 1975. Agencies and Persons Consulted

The NRC staff reviewed the licensee's request and did not consult other agencies or persons.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The Commission has reviewed the proposed exemption to 10 CFR Part 50, Appendix R, relative to the 10 CFR Part 51 requirements.

Based upon the foregoing environmental assessment, the staff concludes that the proposed action will not have a significant effect on the quality of the human environment. Accordingly, the Commission has determined, pursuant to 10 CFR 51.31, not to prepare an environmental impact statement for the proposed action.
