Dear Mr. Pisan:

This is in reply to your letter of March 5, 1958 concerning the establishment of Sectional Committee No. 6 of the American Standards Association and the staffing of Subcommittee No. 5 of this Committee.

In response to your request for the names of candidates to serve on Subcommittee No. 5, we wish to propose the name of Frank G. Legler of this Division. Mr. Legler has a background in physics and electronics and is conversant with the field of nuclear reactor instrumentation and control. He is presently assigned to the Reactor Safety Section of the Engineering Development Branch of this Division and is responsible for formulating and directing research and development programs in reactor instrumentation and control.



Should Mr. Legler be selected to serve on Subcommittee No. 5, his activities will be limited to advisory and liaison functions, and it will not be possible for him to participate in any activity which directly or indirectly binds the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission with regards to standards, policies, procedures and methods. In addition, any opinions that might be expressed by Mr. Legler will be entirely his own and will not necessarily reflect the official views of the Commission. Notwithstanding these limitations, we believe that Mr. Legler will be able to render valuable service as a member of the Subcommittee.

We would like to suggest the names of three other persons whom we believe to be qualified for serving on the Subcommittee. These names are R. P. Epler, Oak Ridge National Laboratory, Oak Ridge, Tennessee; John Kastelic, Westinghouse Atomic Products Division, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and John E. Blums, Brookhaven National Laboratory, Upton, Long Island, New York.

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
