Dear Mr. Lohaus:

My staff has brought the following information to my attention and I would like to share the information with you to consider revision of the conclusions by audit team and Management Review Board for the September 2001 audit of Nevada radioactive materials program.

Staff reviewed the files for the Nevada licenses that the IMPEP team used to construct the summary of 32 licenses for the status of the audit indicator, "Status of the Materials Inspection Program".

<u>License Inspections Counted Overdue Twice</u> - Two licenses from the NRC list appear to have been counted twice by repeating the licenses in the initial overdue and routine overdue portions of the list when it appears that the two licenses were initially inspected overdue during the review period but were not due/overdue again for inspection during the review period.

Specifically, Quantech's license (00-11-0459-01) was issued on August 23, 2000, and was inspected on November 11, 2001, making it a completed overdue initial inspection during the review period, in accordance with the NRC policy. As a NRC Priority 3 license, it would not be due again until November 11, 2004.

Similarly, Las Vegas Surgery Center's license (03-12-0439-01) was issued on July 7, 1999, and was inspected on September 8, 2000, making it a completed overdue initial inspection during the review period, in accordance with the NRC policy. As a NRC Priority 3 license, it would not be due again until September 8, 2003.

It is not obvious me why these two licenses were listed twice in the summary of 32 overdue inspections, considering the above perspective.

<u>License Inspections Conducted on Schedule</u> - In addition, the audit team indicated the following four (4) licenses were inspected in overdue status during the review period; however, we believe the licenses were inspected during the

review period between August 30, 1997 – September 10, 2001 in compliance with the NRC IMC 2800 guidance as we understand it::

It appears that the audit team concluded that these licenses were overdue for inspection during the review period because the old/past Nevada schedule may have been used for the audit indicator compliance determination. We understood that the NRC schedule was supposed to be used to determine compliance with this indicator.

Revision of the Equation Used to Determine Indicator Status Considering.

- a. reduction of the numerator of the calculation by 2 for the 2 licenses described above that we believe should not have been counted overdue twice, and
- b. reduction of the numerator of the calculation by 4 for the 4 licenses listed above that we believe were inspected on schedule in accordance with the NRC schedule and interpretations and we believe should not have been considered overdue and
- c. presuming that the referenced 6 licenses were included as completed and counted only once in the denominator.
- d. a complete explanation of the components of mathematical equation used in this indicator finding was not provided to staff during the audit. Since the audit, we have learned that the denominator is intended to include all completed inspections during the review, whether completed overdue or on-time per the NRC inspection schedule,

the calculation appears to become:

32 licenses inspected overdue -2 (overdue licenses counted twice) - 4 (licenses inspected in compliance with NRC schedule)/110 total inspections completed (on schedule and overdue) =

26/110 =

23.6% of licenses inspected overdue during the review period; not in excess of 25%

It appears that this information suggests that the audit team may have improperly concluded and recommended to the Management Review Board that the status of the Nevada Materials Inspection Program was unsatisfactory when the statistical equation, a threshold used in part we understand to make that conclusion, is <u>not in excess of 25% overdue inspections</u>.
