By letter dated October 18, 2001, you applied for an amendment to Facility Operating License No. DPR-67 for St. Lucie Unit 1 and Facility Operating License NPF-16 for St. Lucie Unit 2. The proposed change would have modified the facility technical specifications pertaining to Engineered Safety Feature Actuation System instrumentation. Subsequently, by letter dated June 6, 2002, you withdrew the amendment request.

NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL OF APPLICATION FOR

AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has granted the request of Florida Power and Light Company, et al. (the licensee) to withdraw its October 18, 2001, application for proposed amendment to Facility Operating License Nos. DPR-67 and NPF-16 for the St. Lucie Plant, Unit Nos. 1 and 2, respectively, located in St. Lucie County, Florida.

The proposed amendment would have revised the Technical Specifications regarding Engineered Safety Feature Actuation System instrumentation to limit the period of time that inoperable recirculation actuation signal, containment spray actuation signal, and auxiliary feedwater actuation signal input channels could be in the bypassed and/or tripped condition.

The Commission had previously issued a Notice of Consideration of Issuance of Amendment published in the FEDERAL REGISTER on November 28, 2001 (66 FR 59507). However, by letter dated June 6, 2002, the licensee withdrew the proposed change.

For further details with respect to this action, see the application for amendment dated October 18, 2001, and the licensee's letter dated June 6, 2002, which withdrew the application for license amendment.
