Attached hereto is a final draft of the document resulting from a meeting held today, January 17, 1961, and attended by Harold Price, Robert Lowenstein, Joseph DiNunno, Frank Gifford and myself. I should like to receive from each member of the ACRS the following:

1. An opinion as to whether the guide is an acceptable compromise. If unacceptable, what are the reasons?
2. If acceptable, would you be willing to approve this document or one like this with minor modifications without a Committee meeting.
3. We should write a letter to the Commission on this document and this may require a meeting.
4. A listing of the days upon which the member would be available for a one-day meeting of the ACRS commencing with January 25, 1961, and thereafter. I suggest Saturday, January 28, 1961 as the best possible date.

As Mr. Price stated to the full ACRS last week, there is a desire on the part of the Commission to publish for public comment a notice concerning the proposed guides. The timing on this matter, of course, relates to the forthcoming 202 Hearings scheduled for February 21 and February 23. The Commission must consider this document during the week of February 6-11, 1961.

Frank Gifford and I believe that at this time complete technical agreement could not be reached sufficiently rapidly to incorporate the man-rem concept explicitly in this document. However, the concept has been treated by a statement in the document which provides for addition of this principle as soon as backup material is available. Other than on this single point, I believe the document follows quite closely the wishes of the Committee.
