Statement: I do recall talking with David Voellen, WBNP Chemistry Superintendent, on June 3, 1996, about problems WBNP were having in Chemistry. I further recall telling Voellen about the two positions (BWR & PWR) at Corporate that would be open. I told him that I would see him a lot more on a lot less. I was referring to either I would get the position or not get the position. I did not advise David Voellen that Fiser would be the odd man out. The only comments that I told Voellen was that I had confidence in my ability, and I wasn't worried about it. I was never told by anyone that I was preselected for the position (PWR).

There was a meeting on June 17, 1996

that was held by Tom McGrath. After the meeting Fisen accused me that the PWR position had already been decided and I would get the position because McGrath had been made the Radchem Manager and McGrath was out to get him. I told Fisen that this wasn't true, and that no one had promise me anything. Fisen stated that now that Ron Groven was not going to be Radchem Manager, he would get the job, because it was already decided. I only got to review the position description one week after it was sent to Human Resource for review. I told Fisen that the position description for PWR was written for him. Fisen acknowledge to me that Groven told him to write the position description. I commented to him, what was I supposed to be, the odd man out on the street if Ron Groven got the job. He replied that I wasn't suppose to return back to corporate from SQWP from being on temporary assignment. He further stated that he was going after McGrath and the first three licks was his, and I knew how to make the system work.

About two weeks later on July 15, 1996 I was contacted by messenger (Wilson McArthur) to go to NSRP, because this site was having problems in the Chemistry Department. During the time I spoke with Dave Yollen I reinitiated to him that I would be working here on staff. I also told him if I didn't get the job, if he would help me with employment in outside of TVA. Further, I stated to Yollen that the position description was written for Fisher. Yes, I recall Givens coming to me and advising me that Charles Fitt and Gordon Rich came to him and ask him about a direct transfer from Corporate to NSRP for me. Givens advised me to think about what I wanted to do. I advised Givens that I would accept the transfer to NSRP. Sometime later I was told by Givens that it was a plan to transfer me to NSRP. I should be allowed to compete for the positions at Corporate. He further stated that he did not know if they had a position or not at NSRP.

I was later contacted by Gordon

which, he advised me that the transfer was being stopped at Corporate. He stated that he heard that Tom McGrath stopped the transfer, because he (McGrath) stated that we should have a competitive process for the Corporate position, and I not be forced to accept a transfer.

The selection for PWC was made sometime in July or August.

The letter dated June 24, 1996 addressing harassment and intimidation of a fellow co-worker was protested and I was told that nothing would become of that letter. I had totally disagreed with the allegations that were made
