

AMENDMENT TO FACILITY LICENSE

Amendment No. 4
License No. TR-2

The Atomic Energy Commission ("the Commission") has found that:

- A. The application for amendment dated May 21, 1970, complies with the requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended ("the Act"), and the Commission's regulations set forth in 10 CFR, Chapter I;
- B. The issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security, or to the health and safety of the public; and
- C. Prior public notice of proposed issuance of this amendment is not required since the amendment does not involve significant hazards considerations different from those previously evaluated.

Accordingly, Facility License No. TR-2, as amended, is further amended by revising paragraph 2.a. to substitute a comma for the period at the end of the sentence and to add thereto:

"and by 'Application to Modify Retired WTR Facility'
dated May 21, 1970."

This amendment is effective as of the date of issuance.

NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF FACILITY LICENSE AMENDMENT

The Atomic Energy Commission has issued, effective as of the date of issuance, Amendment No. 4 to Facility License No. TR-2. The amendment removes from the conditions and requirements of this license the Process Building which is external to the reactor containment building of the deactivated Westinghouse Testing Reactor (WTR) located near Waltz Mill in Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania.

By application dated May 21, 1970, the Westinghouse Electric Corporation (WEC) requested an amendment to Facility License No. TR-2 to remove the Process Building from the defined WTR facility. The Process Building removed from the conditions and requirements of Facility License No. TR-2 will remain under the control of WEC, and be utilized for non-reactor related activities that are subject to AEC materials licenses.


The Commission has found that the application for the amendment complies with the requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended ("the Act"), and the Commission's regulations published in 10 CFR, Chapter I. The Commission has made the findings required by the Act and the Commission's regulations which are set forth in the amendment, and has concluded that the issuance of the amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public.

Within thirty (30) days from the date of publication of the notice in the FEDERAL REGISTER, the applicant may file a request for a hearing and any person whose interest may be affected by this proceeding may file a petition for leave to intervene. Requests for a hearing and petitions to intervene shall be filed in accordance with the Commission's "Rules of Practice" in 10 CFR Part 2. If a request for a hearing or a petition for leave to intervene is filed within the time prescribed in this notice, the Commission will issue a notice of hearing or an appropriate order.

REMOVAL OF PROCESS BUILDING FROM REFIRED WTR FACILITY

By application dated May 21, 1970, the Westinghouse Electric Corporation (WEC) requested authority to exclude the Process Building from those areas comprising the deactivated Westinghouse Reactor facility covered by License No. TR-2.

The Process Building is a physically separate structure from the WTR. The only interface between it and the WTR is along the primary coolant pipe tunnel. A concrete wall barrier exists between the excluded portion of this tunnel and the remainder. Other than the Process Building is separated by at least 40 feet from the WTR. In lieu of the present absolute filter on the vent line for the breathing system of the WTR that is located in the Process Building fan room, WEC will sever the vent line in the fan room and provide another absolute filter at this point to prevent breathing of the WTR vapor container.

WEC intends to use the Process Building for non-reactor related activities. A portion of the building is now used for activities covered by a materials license (SRM-770). Under this proposal, the entire building will be included under the terms of License No. SRM-770 (Docket 70-698). Therefore, any release of radioactivity from the Process Building will continue to be subject to this licensing. Any activity in the Process Building which might involve a potential hazard will be reviewed by WEC's Radiation Protection Committee.

It has been concluded that the proposed deletion of the Process Building from Facility License No. TR-2 does not involve significant hazards considerations and there is reasonable assurance that the health and safety of the public will not be endangered.
