Dear Mr. Stevens:

As a distributor of devices containing byproduct material to persons for use under a general license, the regulations of the State of Connecticut, requires that you provide a report to the responsible Agreement State agency of all transfers of such devices to persons in that state within 30 days after the end of each calendar quarter. The report should, as a minimum, provide the following information:

1. identify the person to whom the device was transferred (i.e., the general licensee) by name and address,
2. provide either the name of a person or a position who may constitute a point of contact between the general licensee and the agency,
3. identify the type and model number of the device transferred, and
4. the quantity and type of byproduct material contained in the device.

In addition, the Texas Department of Health, Bureau of Radiation Control (Agency), the responsible Agreement State agency for Texas, requests that the report also provide the serial numbers, if available, for both the generally licensed device and the radioactive source contained in the device.

10 CFR 31.52(b) also requires that a report be submitted even if no devices have been transferred, if the agency requests such a report. Please be advised that our Agency requests a report, even if no devices have been distributed.
