

**MATERIALS LICENSE**

Pursuant to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, the Energy Reorganization Act of 1974 (Public Law 93-438), and Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter I, Parts 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 40 and 70, and in reliance on statements and representations heretofore made by the licensee, a license is hereby issued authorizing the licensee to receive, acquire, possess, and transfer byproduct, source, and special nuclear material designated below; to use such material for the purpose(s) and at the place(s) designated below; to deliver or transfer such material to persons authorized to receive it in accordance with the regulations of the applicable Part(s); and to import such byproduct and source material. This license shall be deemed to contain the conditions specified in Section 183 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, and is subject to all applicable rules, regulations and orders of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission now or hereafter in effect and to any conditions specified below.

**CONDITIONS**

- 10. Licensed material may be possessed and all laundering activities may be performed only at Environmental Laundries, Inc., North Third Avenue, Royersford, Pennsylvania except that contaminated garments may be picked up, received and possessed in licensee transportation vehicles, and contaminated equipment in the licensee's portable laundry unit may be possessed anywhere in the United States where the Nuclear Regulatory Commission maintains jurisdiction for regulating the use of licensed material.
- 11. The licensee shall comply with the provisions of Title 10, Chapter 1, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 19, "Notices, Instructions and Reports to Workers; Inspections" and Part 20, "Standards for Protection Against Radiation."

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 SUPPLEMENTARY SHEET

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12. Licensed material shall be used by, or under the supervision of, Irving Rosen, Joseph P. Peplinski, Benedetto G. Bosco, Martin W. Bourquin, Michael S. Terpljak, George J. Bukevich, M. Craig Connelly, Gregg A. Johnstone or Thomas B. Nally.
13. The licensee may transport licensed material or deliver licensed material to a carrier for transport in accordance with the provisions of title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 71, "Packaging of Radioactive Material for Transport and Transportation of Radioactive Material Under Certain Conditions."
14. This license does not authorize the packaging or possession of radioactive waste except as authorized pursuant to the laundering activities performed in the licensee's permanent laundry facility located at North Avenue, Royersford, Pennsylvania.
15. This license does not authorize the laundering of contaminated garments at temporary job sites of the licensee or in customer facilities except as specifically authorized pursuant to the terms and conditions of specific licenses issued to customers of the licensee by the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission or an Agreement State.
16. Except as specifically provided otherwise by this license, the licensee shall possess and use licensed material described in Items 6, 7, and 8 of this license in accordance with statements, representations, and procedures contained in application dated September 1, 1982 and attached Tri-State Industrial Laundries, Inc., documents entitled HEAVY PHISICS PROCEDURES dated February 1, 1982, and MOBILE NUCLEAR DECONTAMINATION UNIT (undated); licensee letter dated November 3, 1982 with attached revised procedures; and letters dated January 4, 1984 and January 6, 1984. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's regulations shall govern the licensee's statements in applications or letters, unless the statements are more restrictive than the regulations.
