SUBJECT: ISSUANCE OF AMENDMENT NO. 66 TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE NPF-10  
AND AMENDMENT NO. 55 TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE NPF-15  
SAN ONOFRE NUCLEAR GENERATING STATION, UNITS 2 AND 3  
(TAC NOS. 66492 AND 66493)

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 66 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-10 and Amendment No. 55 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-15 for the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Units 2 and 3, located in San Diego County, California.

These amendments consist of changes to license condition 2.E in both licenses in response to your application dated December 14, 1987.

The amendments approve a minor change in the location of a vital area boundary which slightly increases the size of a vital area. The change affects only the Physical Security Plan which provides a basis for having assurance that acts of radiological sabotage will not significantly impact public health and safety. The change does not alter any safety-related design basis of the facility or its operation, nor does it involve any changes to plant design or operating procedures.

The NRC staff has prepared a Safeguards Evaluation Report in support of these amendments. This report is being withheld from public disclosure under the provisions of 10 CFR 73.21 since it contains safeguards information.

The amendments relate solely to safeguards matters, do not involve any significant construction impacts, and are confined to modifications to systems used for security. Accordingly, the amendments meet the eligibility criteria for categorical exclusion set forth in 10 CFR 51.22(c)(12). Pursuant to 10 CFR 51.22(b), no environmental impact statement or environmental assessment need be prepared in connection with the issuance of the amendments.

We have concluded that (1) there is reasonable assurance that the health and safety of the public will not be endangered by this action, (2) such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations, and (3) the issuance of the amendments will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public.

AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

Amendment No. 66  
License No. NPF-10

1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:
  - A. The application for amendment to the license for San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Unit 2 (the facility) filed by the Southern California Edison Company (SCE) on behalf of itself and San Diego Gas and Electric Company, the City of Riverside and the City of Anaheim, California (licensees) dated December 14, 1987 complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act) and the Commission's regulations as set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
  - B. The facility will operate in conformity with the application, the provisions of the Act, and the regulations of the Commission;
  - C. There is reasonable assurance (i) that the activities authorized by this amendment can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public, and (ii) that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations;
  - D. The issuance of this amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public; and
  - E. The issuance of this amendment is in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51 of the Commission's regulations and all applicable requirements have been satisfied.

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2. Accordingly, paragraph 2.E of Facility Operating License No. NPF-10 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.E. The licensee shall fully implement and maintain in effect all provisions of the physical security, guard training and qualification, and safeguards contingency plans approved by the Commission and all amendments and revisions to such plans made pursuant to 10 CFR 50.54(p). The plans, which contain Safeguards Information protected under 10 CFR 73.21, are entitled: "San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Units 1, 2, and 3 Physical Security Plan," with revisions submitted through July 24, 1987; "San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Units 1, 2, and 3 Guard Training and Qualification Plan," with revisions submitted through December 15, 1981; and "San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Units 1, 2, and 3 Safeguards Contingency Plan," with revisions submitted through September 29, 1983.

The change submitted as Revision 14 to the "San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Units 1, 2, and 3 Physical Security Plan" dated July 24, 1987, is approved on an interim basis, pending possible future requirements to (1) reevaluate vital equipment and areas to be protected against radiological sabotage in nuclear power plants in accordance with NUREG-1178, "Vital Equipment/Area Guidelines Study: Vital Area Committee Report," dated February 1988; and (2) assess vital area barriers on a generic basis against 10 CFR 73.55(a) to determine possible future regulatory requirements.

3. This license amendment is effective as of the date of its issuance and must be fully implemented no later than 30 days from the date of issuance.
