Dear Professor Dr. Rao:

This is in response to your e-mail dated July 4, 2002, to Dr. Farouk Eltawila regarding USNRC's MELCOR code which models the progression of severe accident in light water reactor nuclear power plants. Current U.S. Government policy does not permit formal cooperative contacts with Government of India officials on nuclear safety-related matters. As you may be aware, however, recent high level discussions between our two governments have led to proposals for resumed cooperation in this area. The NRC is currently consulting with the State Department on this matter. Should this matter be resolved in the direction of further cooperation, a governmental organization in India would first sign an agreement with the USNRC to join the Cooperative Severe Accident Research Program (CSARP). Then with the consent of this Indian governmental organization, USNRC would make the MELCOR code available to your organization. Until this matter is resolved, we are unable to extend an invitation for membership to the government of India.

Please feel free to keep in touch on this matter and we can advise you about any changes in policy regarding cooperative arrangements.
