River Bend Station Fitness-for-Duty Six Month Performance Data Report January 1, 2002, to June 30, 2002

PROGRAM SUMMARY:

The RBS annual random testing rate is 50 percent. During this reporting period, approximately 27.9 percent of the population has been randomly tested. The rate of positive tests from random testing is 0.41 percent.

POSITIVE RESULTS:

One contract employee tested positive for amphetamines during pre-access screening and one contract employee tested positive for marijuana on a random test.

Two licensee employees and two contract employees tested negative on for-cause tests (3-post accident / 1-behavior).

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS:

Access was denied for both contract employees who tested positive for marijuana and amphetamines. Management was notified and their individual files were annotated to reflect the positive results and the actions taken.

No employees participated in the follow-up program during this reporting period.

EVENTS REPORTED TO THE NRC:

During this reporting period, there were no violations of the fitness for duty program that were reportable.

PROGRAM EVALUATION:

No programmatic problems were identified during this reporting period.
