Subject: Issuance of Amendment No. 18 to Facility Operating License NPF-10  
and Amendment No. 6 to Facility Operating License NPF-15 -  
San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Units 2 and 3

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued the enclosed Amendment No. 18 to Facility Operating License NPF-10 and Amendment No. 6 to Facility Operating License NPF-15 for the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Units 2 and 3, located in San Diego County, California. The amendments modify the emergency preparedness license conditions to include two requirements imposed by the Atomic Safety and Licensing Appeal Board Decision of March 4, 1983 (ALAB-717).

In ALAB-717, the Appeal Board affirmed the Licensing Board's January 11 and May 14, 1982 decisions authorizing the issuance of full power operating licenses for San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Units 2 and 3, subject to the following license conditions:

- "1. Within 120 days applicants are to undertake further efforts to assemble and to keep current as reasonably complete a list as possible of housebound people within the plume emergency planning zone who would require transportation assistance in the event of an evacuation."
- "2. Within 120 days a training program is to be developed and initiated to assist Orange County Transit District bus drivers in the discharge of their responsibilities in the event of a radiological emergency at San Onofre."

The enclosed amendments implement the Appeal Board's Decision.

We have determined that the issuance of these amendments will not result in any significant environmental impact and that pursuant to 10 CFR 51.5(d)(4) an environmental impact statement, or negative declaration and environmental impact appraisal need not be prepared in connection with issuance of this amendment.

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A copy of the Federal Register notice which has been forwarded to the Office of Federal Register for publication is also enclosed.

1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:
  - A. The application for a license to operate the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Unit 2 (the facility) filed by the Southern California Edison Company on behalf of itself and San Diego Gas and Electric Company, The City of Riverside and The City of Anaheim, California (licensees), complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act) and the Commission's regulations as set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
  - B. The facility will operate in conformity with the application, as amended, the provisions of the Act, and the regulations of the Commission;
  - C. There is reasonable assurance (i) that the activities authorized by this amendment can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public, and (ii) that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
  - D. The issuance of the license amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public; and
  - E. The issuance of this amendment is in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51 of the Commission's regulations and all applicable requirements have been satisfied.

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2. Accordingly, the license is amended by adding a new paragraph 2.C.(23)d to read as follows:

d. Conditions of ALAB-717, March 4, 1983

- i. By July 2, 1983, SCE shall provide evidence that it has undertaken further efforts to assemble and to keep current as reasonably complete a list as possible of household people within the plume emergency planning zone who would require transportation assistance in the event of an evacuation.
- ii. By July 2, 1983, SCE shall provide evidence that a training program has been developed and initiated to assist Orange County Transit District bus drivers in the discharge of their responsibilities in the event of a radiological emergency at San Onofre.

3. This license amendment is effective on April 27, 1983.

AMENDMENT TO FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE

Amendment No. 6  
License No. NPF-15

1. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has found that:
  - A. The application for a license to operate for the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Unit 3 (the facility) filed by the Southern California Edison Company on behalf of itself and San Diego Gas and Electric Company, The City of Riverside and The City of Anaheim, California (licensees) complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act) and the Commission's regulations as set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
  - B. The facility will operate in conformity with the application, as amended, the provisions of the Act, and the regulations of the Commission;
  - C. There is reasonable assurance (i) that the activities authorized by this amendment can be conducted without endangering the health and safety of the public, and (ii) that such activities will be conducted in compliance with the Commission's regulations set forth in 10 CFR Chapter I;
  - D. The issuance of this license amendment will not be inimical to the common defense and security or to the health and safety of the public; and
  - E. The issuance of this amendment is in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51 of the Commission's regulations and all applicable requirements have been satisfied.

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2. Accordingly, the license is amended by adding a new paragraph 2.C.(18)d to read as follows:

d. Conditions of ALAB 717, March 4, 1983

- i. By July 2, 1983, SCE shall provide evidence that it has undertaken further efforts to assemble and to keep current as reasonably complete a list as possible of housebound people within the plume emergency planning zone who would require transportation assistance in the event of an evacuation.
- ii. By July 2, 1983, SCE shall provide evidence that a training program has been developed and initiated to assist Orange County Transit District bus drivers in the discharge of their responsibilities in the event of a radiological emergency at San Onofre.

3. This license amendment is effective on April 27, 1983.

FACILITY OPERATING LICENSE NOS. NPF-10 AND NPF-15

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (the Commission) has issued Amendment No. 18 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-10, and Amendment No. 6 to Facility Operating License No. NPF-15 to Southern California Edison Company (SCE), San Diego Gas and Electric Company, The City of Riverside, California and The City of Anaheim, California (licensees) for the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station, Units 2 and 3 (the facility) located in San Diego County, California. These amendments are effective April , 1983.

The amendments modify the Emergency Preparedness license conditions to require further efforts to assemble and keep current a list of housebound people within the Plume Exposure Emergency Planning Zone, and to develop and initiate a training program to assist Orange County Transit District bus drivers in the event of a radiological emergency at San Onofre. These amendments were authorized by the Atomic Safety and Licensing Appeal Board's Decision of March 4, 1983, ALAB-717.

Issuance of these amendments complies with the standards and requirements of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended (the Act), and the Commission's regulations. The Commission has made appropriate findings as required by the Act and the Commission's regulations in 10 CFR Chapter I, which are set forth in the license amendments.
