Dear Senator McConnell:

Late last year, I had the opportunity to visit the Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant in Paducah, Kentucky. I had the pleasure of having Senator Jim Bunning accompany me on my visit. During that visit, I conducted an extensive tour of the plant, met with plant employees, and held a press conference. I also met with senior executives, including Jim Miller, United States Enrichment Corporation's (USEC) Executive Vice President for Production, to discuss important matters facing the nuclear industry and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). I believe the visit was successful because it gave me a hands-on perspective of the plant's performance, it provided an opportunity for USEC management and me to exchange views on important matters, and it provided an excellent forum for me to share information about the nuclear industry with plant employees, the public, and the media.

I am aware that many of your constituents are interested in the safety and economic issues associated with the Paducah plant. As I have done with a number of Senators and Congressmen over the last year, I would like to extend an offer to personally brief you on the results of my visit. Not only will this allow me to share with you my impression of the facility, but I can also discuss my own views of how electric industry restructuring and our reinvention efforts at the NRC may affect your constituents.
