Date of amendment request: January 25, 1983 (PCN-43)

Description of amendment request: The amendment would add the Manager of
Station Security, the Manager of Station Emergency Preparedness, the Manager
of Material and Administrative Services, and the Manager of Configuration
Control and Compliance to the list of managers authorized to review and approve
station procedures that govern activities in their respective areas of respon-
sibility.

Basis for proposed no significant hazards consideration determination: The
Commission has provided guidance concerning the application of the standards
for determining whether a significant hazards consideration exists by providing
certain examples (48 FR 14780) of amendments that are considered not likely to
involve significant hazards considerations. One of the examples, (i), relates
to a purely administrative change to the Technical Specifications (TS), for

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example, a change to achieve consistency throughout the Technical Specifications, correction of an error, or a change in nomenclature. The proposed change authorizes additional functional managers of the Station staff to review and approve Station procedures and changes thereto that govern activities in their respective areas of responsibility. These managers are qualified, by virtue of their education, experience, and training to provide this function. The Station Manager retains overall responsibility for procedures as required by TS 6.5.2.1. Accordingly, the Commission proposes to determine that this change does not involve a significant hazards consideration because this change to the TS affects only the present organizational structure of the plant staff and has no effect on the operating parameters of the facility.
