The purpose of this letter is to express California's continued interest in participating in the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC's) State Liaison Officer (SLO) Program and to inform you of my appointment of James D. Boyd, Commissioner, California Energy Commission (CEC), as the California State Liaison Officer to the NRC. His extensive experience (over two decades) in federal/state cooperative efforts related to environmental, energy and public-health policies in California will greatly benefit the cooperative efforts between the NRC and the State of California.
