Dear Mr. Holonich:

Enclosed for your information are the Reynolds Electrical & Engineering Co., Inc. (REECo) Management Control Procedure 01.0, Revision 3, "Organization"; Quality Assurance Requirements and Description (QARD) Implementation Matrix defining all QARD requirements that apply to the REECo scope of work; a matrix report of areas "Not Applicable" to the REECo Quality Assurance Program; and the REECo Policy Statement. The policy statement, dated July 29, 1993, is an integral part of the REECo Quality Assurance Procedures Manual for the Yucca Mountain Site Characterization Office. This documentation defines REECo compliance with the QARD DOE/RW-0333P, Revision 0.

The U.S. Department of Energy baseline acceptance of the REECo program was effective March 11, 1994. The following QARD sections are applicable to REECo as defined in the assigned work scope:

Criterion 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, and Appendix C

The enclosed Requirements Traceability Network (RTN) Requirements Matrix Report (No. 007) indicates each QARD requirement and its implementation by REECo. In addition, the degree of applicability for the above-noted sections is indicated in the enclosed RTN Matrix Report (No. 040) which lists the specific QARD requirements that are Not Applicable (N/A) to the REECo scope of work. REECo has taken no exceptions to the QARD.

The Office of Quality Assurance acceptance status of future updates will be indicated on the RTN database.


YUCCA MOUNTAIN PROJECT POLICY

REECO considers Quality Assurance an essential element of all of its activities. The REECO Quality Assurance Program for the Yucca Mountain Project (YMP) is based upon the U.S. Department of Energy, Office of Civilian Radioactive Waste Management, Quality Assurance Requirements and Description document, DOE/RW-0333P QARD.

It is the policy of REECO/YMP to apply an approach to Quality Assurance that recognizes the importance of radiological and nonradiological safety in all its operations. We will fully understand and achieve conformance to customer requirements at all times and conduct all operations in a manner that will yield defect-free products and services.

REECO YMP intends to apply these Quality Assurance practices to the YMP consistent with REECO Company policies. Where there are differences between REECO Company requirements and REECO/YMP requirements, those requirements established within the Quality Assurance Requirements and Description document, for the YMP, will take precedence.

Compliance with the requirements of the REECO/YMP Quality Assurance Program is mandatory for all personnel who have been or who will be assigned responsibilities for performing activities for the REECO/YMP.
