Dear Judges Bollwerk, Kline, and Lam:

I write on behalf of the California Coastal Commission to request that full public hearings be held on all issues related to the expanded storage and ultimate relocation of radioactive waste generated by the Diablo Canyon nuclear power plant in San Luis Obispo County.

The Coastal Commission is responsible for carrying out regulatory requirements pursuant to the California Coastal Act and processing federal consistency reviews of federal actions, including permits and licenses, that affect coastal resources pursuant to the federal Coastal Zone Management Act. Although the Commission lacks jurisdiction to address nuclear safety issues relating to the storage and transportation of radioactive material used at the plant, the Commission will likely have regulatory review responsibility relative to other aspects of any development on site or elsewhere in the coastal zone in support of expanded storage or transportation of the material.

The Commission is very concerned about potential impacts of the activity on coastal resources. Given the complexity and importance of the issues associated with the proposed project, the Commission thinks it is important to generate as much analytical and substantive documentation as is necessary to fully inform the decision-making process both at the NRC and the Commission. The Commission has found that providing the public an opportunity to fully participate in matters of great public interest is a most effective way to ensure that all the relevant issues are identified, carefully analyzed, and adequately considered before final decisions are made.
