

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION COLLECTION REQUEST

Title: 10 CFR Part 9, Public Records

Current Burden/Responses: 3,459 hours/13, 656 responses

Proposed Burden/Responses: 2,832 hours/11,272 responses

Frequency of Response: On occasion

Number of Respondents: 11,272

Reasons for Changes in Burden/Responses: The overall burden has decreased from 3,459 to 2,832 hours because of the following:

(1) reduction in the number of responses by 2,300 (from 13,000 to 10,700) resulting in a reduction of 575 hours (from 3,250 to 2,675 hours) for Section 9.23(a)(1) because of the increased availability of documents on-line through the Agency-wide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS);

(2) reduction in the number of responses by 100 (from 500 to 400) resulting in a reduction of 25 hours (from 125 to 100 hours) for Section 9.23(b) because of a re-estimate of the number of annual responses based on the actual number of responses received during the past 3 years.

(3) reduction in burden per response for Sections 9.41(b) and 9.54(b) from 3 hours to .5 hours because of an error in the previous clearance package which should have been .3 hours instead of 3 hours, thereby reducing the burden for Section 9.41(b) from 15 hours to 2.5 hours, and Section 9.54(b) from 30 hours to 5 hours.

(4) increase in the number of respondents for Section 9.54(a)(1) from 1 respondent to 10 respondents based on the actual number of responses received during the past 3 years which resulted in a burden increase of 4.5 hours from .5 to 5 hours.

The rate has increased from \$140 to \$152.

The information required from the public is necessary to identify the records they are requesting; to justify requests for waivers or reductions in searching or copying fees or to justify expedited processing.
