On June 11, and July 10, 2002 the inspector traveled to the office of the Mathies Mine off of Route 88 in			
New Eagle, Pennsylvania to verify that a Texas Nuclear Density Gauge, Model 5201, Serial Number			
B3109 was being safely stored. The

unable to gain access into the building since all doors were locked and no one was on the premises.

On August 20, 2002 the Inspector contacted the site Maintenance Foreman, Dennis Coffer (412) 979-			
4297, who provided entry to the office. The Inspector determined that gauge was stored under a shelf in its original shipping container. The container was sealed with steel bands, appeared never to have been			
opened and was properly labeled with radiation warning signs.			
opened and was properly labeled with radiation warning signs.			
The Inspector was unable to verify the devices' serial number because of its position. Radiation			
measurements made at the surface of the outer container averaged less than 4 millirems per hour.			
Discussions with the foreman indicated that there was only one key to the office and that key was in his			
possession. He explained that he was aware that its security must be maintained and that he routinely			
checks the security of the office during normal working hours and during off hours a watchman patrols			
the facility. Hatteras hopes to reopen the mine in the future and expects to use the gauge at that time.			
The Inspector reviewed the contents of TI 2800-032 with the foreman and determined that the device			
was safely stored. No violations were identified.			
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
