Dear Congressman Malone:

I am writing this letter to hopefully obtain relief from what we believe is an inordinately high license levy against Nuclear Scanning Associates. I have outlined the facts of this situation below:

- Earlier this year, we received our annual licensing bill from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. As we have done in previous years, we filed as a "Small Business Entity", as this entity earned less than \$350,000 over the past year. Accordingly, we paid our \$500 fee.
- In late March, 2002, we decided to close our Nuclear Medicine program. In fact, our program serviced its last patient in September, 2000. Having made a call to the NRC regarding our intent to close the program, we sent a letter to the Commission dated April 5, 2002 requesting termination.
- Later, the NRC issued us a termination of service notice dated June 25, 2002.
- On July 1, 2002, the NRC billed us for \$4,121.85, reasoning that it had the right to include the other legal entities, such as Housatonic Valley Radiology-which does not provide any nuclear medicine services- for the purpose of reassigning our nuclear medicine program from a "small business" status to that of a "small organization".
- When we questioned this invoice, a letter dated July 3, 2002, providing an explanation was sent to us.
- Dr. Ehrlich, the sole owner of Nuclear Scanning Associates, next sent a written letter dated July 19, 2002 to Diane Dandois requesting further consideration for adjusting what we considered to be an abnormally high bill.

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• On August 13, 2002 in a telephone conversation with Dr. Ehrlich, Diane Dandois offered that this licensing bill could be reduced by about 50% if it can be documented that we initiated our termination request prior to March 31, 2002.

In conclusion, we would obviously wish to be considered a small business entity as we have in the past, particularly given the fact that our nuclear medicine department earned nothing over the past year. Specifically, we find it quite unfair that after paying for our license fee as an entity earning less than \$350,000 that the NRC can now consider the income of other organizations also owned by Dr. Ehrlich, but none of which are related to the NRC's purview. Finally, we find that the NRC is rather inflexible in not even offering us the ability to reduce our bill by 50% simply because there is no documentation of our intent to terminate our nuclear medicine department prior to March 31, 2002.

We do hope that you might intercede on our behalf that we can strike a fair compromise. Please call me if you have any further questions.
