Dear Mr. Irwin:

This is a followup to Chairman Richard Meserve's letter to Governor Ridge, dated August 19, 2002, concerning the Homeland Security Advisory System (HSAS). In that letter, the Chairman advised that the NRC had implemented a Threat Advisory and Protective Measures System, effective August 19, 2002, to conform to the HSAS. This NRC system implemented a means of communicating changes in the threat conditions to our licensees, provided a system for activating our Incident Response Center in times of heightened threat, and implemented guidelines for responding to changes in the threat condition at NRC facilities.

The NRC Threat Advisory and Protective Measures System was provided to the NRC's licensees by means of Regulatory Issue Summaries (RISs), copies of which were enclosed in the August 19 letter. This letter encloses a new RIS issued to another category of NRC licensee. The RIS contains sensitive unclassified Safeguards Information (as defined by Section 147 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended) and must be protected in accordance with 10 CFR 73.21.
