Dear Mr. Lesar:

I would like to vigorously object to the building of a Uranium enrichment plant being planned for Hartsville, Tennessee.

This location is short distance south of the Gallatin, TN. Airport and on the approach and departure zone of the Nashville, TN Internationally airport. Sooner or later it will require a prohibited zone around this plant which will cost the airlines and general aviation airplane owners millions of dollars to fly a great distance around this plant. It will adversely affect all traffic to several airports around this site.

The plant is short distance from Gallatin, TN, close to Lebanon, TN, Goodlettsville, TN, Hendersonville, TN and not very far from Metropolitan Nashville, TN. There are not any good 4 lane roads connecting to this plant site. Traffic to and from this site will have to pass through some of the above cities.

The plant site is up river from Goodlettsvile, Hendersonville, Nashville, and many other cities. I know LES says the plant is safe and radiation leaks are not possible, but what happens if they have an accident or an airplane was to crash into this plant, then what happens to everyone down river where all the cities and towns get their water?

Hartsville, TN is a terrible place to put this plant. Why not put it some place that already is involved with nuclear material like Oak Ridge, TN., Paducah, KY, or close to a power plant that is already protected against terrorist. These places
