Dear Senator Kerry:

This is in response to your letter to Mr. Dennis Rathbun, Director of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC's) Office of Congressional Affairs dated October 22, 2002. In the letter you asked that we review materials submitted by one of your constituents, Mr. S. K. Ho, President and Chief Executive Officer of WebEyeAlert, a company based in Chelmsford, Massachusetts.

We appreciate the opportunity to review the information provided. However, NRC has recently committed to purchase a digital disk recording system. In April 2002, NRC initiated discussions with General Services Administration/Federal Protective Service (GSA/FPS) relative to the upgrade of existing closed circuit television equipment. GSA/FPS proposed a Digital Recording and Network Interface Unit. Equipment was purchased in August and a contractor was selected to perform the installation.

Consequently, WebEyeAlert does not appear to be an application for which the NRC has an identified need at this time. However, we encourage Mr. Ho and WebEyeAlert to visit http://fedbizopps.gov, the web site for contracting opportunities with the Federal government.

Thank you for forwarding the information to the NRC for our consideration.
