Dear Dr. Hendee:

I am responding on behalf of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to your letter of November 19, 2002, written on behalf of the American Board of Radiology and other certification boards. Your letter expressed concerns regarding possible revisions to 10 CFR Part 35 that could impact NRC recognition of the various certification boards. Specifically, you requested that the Commission make the NRC staff options paper on this matter public. You also reiterated the desire of the certification boards for continued NRC recognition that the boards provide "evidence of competency" for their diplomats.
