SUBJECT: Revision of NRC Enforcement Policy (67 Fed. Reg. 66311 – October 31, 2002), 10 CFR Part 26, Fitness-for-Duty Programs, Policy Statement Revision; Opportunity for Public Comment

Dear Mr. Lesar:

These comments are submitted on behalf of the nuclear energy industry by the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI)¹ in response to the Federal Register notice (67 Fed. Reg. 66311 – October 31, 2002) concerning the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC) opportunity for comments relative to Revision of Enforcement Policy in regard to 10 CFR Part 26, Fitness-for-Duty Programs.

Our primary concern is one of timing. The effective date for implementation of the NRC Enforcement Policy revision is December 30, 2002. While the Commission is expected to issue Interim Compensatory Measures (ICM) for access authorization in the near future, this ICM is expected to significantly change some fitness-for-duty (FFD) program elements of 10 CFR Part 26 and, by extension, the proposed enforcement discretion.

To avoid a situation where licensees would have to prepare two separate changes in quick succession to FFD programs, we request that the effective date of this enforcement discretion be changed to match the implementation date of the anticipated Order for the ICM. Additionally, utilities should be advised that this
