Our January 24, 2003, we sent a letter to you indicating FEMA's initial assessment of two Deficiencies identified during the exercise (one for the State of New Hampshire and one for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts) regarding the issuance of KI during the exercise as stated in their November 7, 2002, letters to the States. Subsequent to those letters, in its final assessment, FEMA re-evaluated the issues as being areas requiring corrective action (ARCA's). Therefore, the Final Exercise Report contains no Deficiencies, however, there were a total of 31 ARCA's identified during the exercise. Please continue your assistance to the offsite agencies to resolve the issues in a timely manner.
