Dear Mr. Meserve:

Following on Charlie Pryor's announcement of the appointment of Jim Fici as senior vice president, Customer Relations & Sales, effective April 1, 2003, I am pleased to make the following organizational changes within Westinghouse Electric Company.

Until a successor is named, Jim will have dual oversight for both Customer Relations & Sales and a reconfigured nuclear plant projects business, which is being renamed the Nuclear Power Plants business unit. This new business unit will focus exclusively on the very vital new plant arena, with particular attention to satisfying the project requirements of our valued customers in Korea and Japan and supporting new plant opportunities in the U.S., Japan, China, and Europe.

To create that singular focus on new plant opportunities for the Nuclear Power Plants business unit and to make it easier for our customers to do business with us, we are transferring two product lines to the Nuclear Services business unit: automation and replacement steam generators.

The automation product line will be combined with the Repair & Replacement Services organization, effective April 1, 2003. Automation is an important product line for Westinghouse, and this provides operating utility customers with a single point of contact for a full scope of I&C services – from vintage replacement parts to new digital I&C systems.

Michele DeWitt will lead this newly formed organization. Michele will maintain a close working relationship with the project managers for our new plant work in South Korea to ensure continuity and compliance with those important customer requirements. She will continue to report to Nuclear Services Senior Vice President Aris Candris. Mike Comiskey, formerly vice president, Automation, will assist Michele in a transition period after which his new assignment will be announced.

Due to the commonality of business relationships and worldwide supplier bases, the replacement steam generator product line will be merged into Nuclear Services. This new organization, with a focus on steam generator and pressurizer replacement/installation and procurement of major components, will be led by Mark Kachmar, who is appointed director, Major Component Replacement Projects and Engineering. This combination will provide heightened visibility and take advantage of the significant relationships Mark has forged with various major component fabricators. Mark will report to Nick Liparulo, vice president, global Engineering Services.

I feel strongly that these changes I am announcing today position Westinghouse to more effectively meet the ongoing needs and expectations of our global nuclear utility customers. All of us at Westinghouse look forward to working in close cooperation with our customers to achieve operational performance goals and respond to future challenges.
