SUBJECT: CLOSURE OF INVESTIGATION (OI 4-2002-039)

Dear Mr. Dagley:

This letter is in reference to an investigation conducted by the NRC Office of Investigations (OI) regarding activities by Aro-Tek, Limited. OI initiated the investigation to determine whether Aro-Tek deliberately distributed unauthorized by-product materials in unapproved devices in the form of weapons sights containing tritium.

Based on the evidence developed during the investigation, testimony, and document reviews, the allegation was not substantiated. The technical staff's review of the OI investigation found that no NRC regulation had been violated by Aro-Tek and that enforcement against Aro-Tek was not warranted. The NRC plans no further action regarding this investigation and considers this case closed.
