
Dear Dr.Travers and Dr.Thadani:

It is my humble opinion that the subject matter is directly linked to the activities of both your Offices. Please take some of your precious time to read the introductions of all three Patents that have generated a series International Conference Papers that have been reviewed, published and presented with relevance to the safety issues in nuclear industries, then you may agree with me why I am persisting on the subject matter. The new data generated from these BASIC Patents together with the published papers can be used for preparation of the PSAR for building new Nuclear Reactors as well as for reviewing the safety issues of Old Nuclear Reactors. The Trajectory Solid Angle Patent (TSA) was also involved in results against the WASH 1400 report which was also mentioned in the Remarks of Commissioner Nil J Diaz in his paper " When.. Large is Small and Small is Large " presented on March 5, 2002 before the 2002 RIC. Back to 1979 and earlier, in addition to my frequent meetings with MIT Institute Professor Philip M. Morse , I also met with MIT Prof. Norman Russmussen who was the Project Director producing WASH 1400 report . 
Dear Scott:

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
