Request for Information

Describe the actions you have taken or plan to take to assure that this matter is not having a chilling effect on the willingness of other employees to raise safety and compliance concerns within your organization and to the NRC.

Union Electric Response:

Union Electric has always recognized its licensee responsibilities for our personnel as well as our contractors. We take a very proactive and serious approach to ensure our personnel and contractors maintain compliance with NRC regulations.

Our Employee Concerns Program (ECP) has been actively investigating and monitoring the concerns of The Wackenhut Corporation (TWC) individual involved in the subject Department of Labor (DOL) case, as well as any concerns raised by others. The concerned individual brought his discrimination concern to our ECP personnel in July 2002. We promptly investigated this concern and did not substantiate the concern. Since then, there has been frequent and open dialogue with the ECP personnel, the concerned individual, site TWC management and TWC corporate management to ensure this individual is being treated fairly and in accordance with NRC regulations. We have conducted an additional ECP investigation to address the concerned individual's claim of a chilling effect towards him since he filed his complaint with DOL in October 2002. This investigation was completed in February 2003. The results of this investigation did not substantiate a chilling effect directed to the concerned individual since he filed his complaint, nor since DOL issued their ruling in January 2003. In the course of this investigation, several TWC personnel and Union Electric personnel responsible for Security were interviewed. The investigation did not identify there was a chilling effect from the DOL ruling which may hinder raising safety and compliance concerns to our organization, contractors and to the NRC by any personnel at the Callaway site.

We take our commitments to a safety conscious work environment (SCWE) at the Callaway Plant very seriously. For example, as part of our on-going efforts, we have contracted with a professional survey firm, used by many of the nuclear industry stations, to perform an independent survey of the SCWE at Callaway Plant. All Union Electric Nuclear Division personnel and our on site-contractors will be given the opportunity to participate in this survey scheduled to be performed in April 2003, with results expected in the July-August 2003 timeframe.

In the interim, until we have our independent survey results, our ECP personnel, Union Electric management and contractor management will continue to vigilantly monitor and promote our SCWE and take the appropriate actions to ensure we are in compliance with our regulatory requirements and commitments. I have personally communicated these expectations to Mr. Richard Michau, President, TWC Nuclear Services Division.
