Subject: MEDIA INTEREST IN INADVERTENT FIRING OF DEPLETED URANIUM (DU) PROJECTILES

On May 6, 1994, the Navy Radiation Safety Committee advised Region II of the accidental firing of two depleted uranium (DU) projectiles. The incident occurred at approximately 1:30 p.m. (local time), May 5, 1994, and involved the accidental firing of two 20mm DU rounds from the USS Lake Erie's Close In Weapons System (CIWS) while the ship was at its berth at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. The Navy believes that the rounds, each of which contains 70 grams of DU, fell in a non-residential area near Aiea, HI. No reports of injury or property damage have been received by the licensee. The Navy has initiated an investigation into the incident and is attempting to locate the projectiles. There has been local media interest and the licensee is prepared to response to press inquiries.

This report is for information only inasmuch as the munitions are not covered by an NRC license. RIV has been informed. The licensee has informed the State of Hawaii.
