The detailed comments provided in the draft SRM could result in the release of some information that should be withheld. Although, we continue to believe that the guidance to the staff on the release of information to the public contained in COMSECY-01-0030 only needed slight modification, as indicated in Commissioner Diaz' vote, we offer the following comments on the draft SRM:

Item 1: Replace "provide a clear and significant" with "reasonably be expected to"

Item 2: Add "Information that had been previously placed in the PDRs is not considered to be 'currently widely available'."

Item 8: Replace "be cautioned to" with "generally."

Item 12: Drop the word "high".

Items 14 and 17: Replace "would clearly" with "could reasonably be expected to".

Item 18: Replace "clearly would" with "'could reasonably be expected to".
