ISSUANCE OF SURVEILLANCE RECORD YMP-SR-94-049 RESULTING FROM YUCCA MOUNTAIN QUALITY ASSURANCE DIVISION (YMQAD) SÜRVEILLANCE OF THE YUCCA MOUNTAIN SITE CHARACTERIZATION OFFICE (YMSCO). LAS VEGAS, NEVADA (SCPB: N/A)

Enclosed is the report of Surveillance YMP-SR-94-049 conducted by the YMQAD at the YMSCO facilities in Las Vegas, Nevada

The purpose of the surveillance was to verify implementation of procedure YLP-2.1Q-YMPO, Revision 0, Yucca Mountain Project Office Qualification and Training.

One Corrective Action Request (CAR) was generated as a result of this surveillance. Response to the CAR (which was transmitted via separate letter) is due by the date indicated in Block 11 of the CAR. A response to this surveillance report is not necessary.

The following additional discrepancies were identified on training records during the review:

- There was insufficient evidence to support baseline training or the YMSCO Training Officer.
- Block 9 on the Training Assignment form for the Acting Project Manager was not checked as required by procedure.
- The Training Assignment form for the Deputy Project Manager has not been completed or sent to the Training Officer.
- An extension request for completion of training for the Assistant Manager for Suitability and Licensing did not provide justification for the extension as required by procedure.
- An individual in the Systems and Requirements Team has not completed Quality Assurance Requirements and Description document training.

(Block 10 Continued) SURVEILLANCE CONCLUSIONS:

The surveillance results determined that training of YMSCO personnel who were reassigned responsibilities due to the Project Office reorganization is marginally effective. The number of deficiencies noted during the surveillance and identified in CAR YMP-SR-94-042 concluded that the training objectives as a result of the YMSCO Reorganization Transition Plan have not been completely accomplished. It is recommended that a thorough investigation be conducted by the Training Department to determine the extent of the noted deficiencies and to assure that the training program produces and maintains documentation supporting that personnel performing activities subject to Quality Assurance program controls are qualified, properly trained and proficient for the activity being performed.

Additionally, as this surveillance specifically targeted the qualification, training and proficiency of YMSCO DOE personnel, a subsequent surveillance will be conducted to determine the adequacy and effectiveness of training for personnel i.e. the Civilian Radioactive Waste Management System Management and Operating Contractor and other participant personnel that exclusively perform management and integration functions in support of the YMSCO.

(Block 9 Continued) BASIS OF EVALUATION/DESCRIPTION OF OBSERVATION:

The purpose of this surveillance was to evaluate the training of Yucca Mountain Site Characterization Project Office (YMSCO) personnel (U. S. Department of Energy (DOE) personnel only) for adequacy and effectiveness. The surveillance consisted of review of individual training files, training assignment completion and proficiency. Also evaluated was compliance with procedure YLP-2.1Q-YMPO, "Yucca Mountain Project Office Qualification and Training."

The following observations are provided relative to the effectiveness of training for YMSCO personnel:

The surveillance was limited to review of training and qualification records for YMSCO DOE personnel only. The evaluation focused on those individuals who were reassigned new roles and responsibilities as a result of the Reorganization Transition Plan for the YMSCO that required job change qualification and training and several new employee training files were also examined. The surveillance was accomplished by the review of documented training records contained in individual training files.

As a result of the surveillance, Corrective Action Request (CAR) YM-94-042 was issued to identify the following deficiencies:

There was no evidence to verify that the Assistance Manager and Deputy Assistant Manager for Suitability and Licensing and the Deputy Manager for Scientific Programs have completed training assignments by the scheduled completion date and the Training Officer did not notify the appropriate supervisor, as required.

The Supervisor for the Assistant Manager for Administration assigned his training assignment beyond the 30-day requirement. Also, the Training Assignment form had anomalies such as wrong review number for documents, line-through without initial and date and missing entries.

The Assistant Manager for Engineering and Field Operations completed Part II of the Position Qualification Statement form prior to an employees verification of education and experience.
