.9 Basis of Evaluation/Description of Observations:

The purpose of this surveillance report is to determine the impact on quality-affecting work, if any, due to an incident in which a water truck accidentally bumped into a drillhole casing stick-up causing damage.

On December 6, 1993, a Reynolds Electrical and Engineering Company, Inc. (REECo) water truck backed over the borehole casing stick-up at NRG-2, causing the casing to break off approximately five feet below the top of the casing. REECo maintenance personnel repaired the casing within several hours of the incident.

The following day, December 7, 1993, geophysical logging activities were successfully conducted at this borehole. Discussions with Loren "Bud" Thompson, Geophysical Logging Coordinator, indicated that logging activities were completed as expected, casing depth was determined to be at the predicted depth and logging was completed to the bottom of the hole.
