### Block 9 (continued) Basis of Evaluation/Description of Observations:

On December 6, 1994, Nye County Nuclear Waste Repository Project Office commenced their on-site independent verification and testing activities as agreed to by the Department of Energy (DOE) in accordance with the "Protocol Addressing Procedures for Nye County On-Site Representation During Yucca Mountain Project Site Characterization Activities" (the Protocol) and "Appendix A: Access and Procedures for On-site Independent Verification and Testing." The responsibility of DOE during testing by Nye County is limited to maintaining the integrity of the site in accordance with 10 CFR 60.15 (d) (1). In assuring that activities performed by Nye County would have no adverse affect on the site, Test Planning Package(TPP) 95-03, Revision 0, "Nye County Drilling: UE-25 ONC#1 and USW NRG-4 Instrumentation" was assembled by DOE outlining quality affecting requirements which must be observed to ensure site integrity.

This surveillance was performed to assure that these requirements were met by Nye County during their drilling activities at UE-25 ONC#1.

The status of the Nye County drilling program at the time of this surveillance was:

- a) Borehole depth of 336 feet. Note: projected depth is 1,800 feet.
- b) Drilling was being performed dry.
- c) Changing out the drill bit was in process.
- d) No perched water bodies encountered to date.

The following quality attributes, as derived from TPP 95-03, were verified:

- a. No apparent low spots where water would be trapped.
- b. Drainage ditches on the low side of the pad.
- c. Stationary equipment was placed on sheets of plastics to catch oil spills.
- d. An empty 7000 gallon tank was available on the drilling site in the event that perched water is encountered during the drilling operation.
- e. The drilling operation is dry, no water is used for dust control. (Dust is controlled by means of a self contained vacuum system.)
- f. The records indicate that tracers have not been used in the air to flush the cuttings out of the borehole.
- g. A material record is maintained to indicate the kind and amount of materials used. So far, the records contain only those materials used to cement the casing in place, i.e., cement, cal-seal (60 Gypsum cement). Note: The daily log indicated calcium chloride which is to be corrected to calcium sulfate (cal-seal is calcium sulfate or gypsum).

In addition, periodic monthly inspections of the pad are required by the TPP. Drilling operation started on 12/6/94, so periodic inspections, as such, had not been performed.

#### Block 10 (continued) Surveillance Conclusions:

No discrepencies were noted. The Nye County drilling operation is being conducted in accordance to a documented program, i.e., TTP 95-03, Revision 0. In the performance of this surveillance, the cooperation and courtesy encountered from all persons contacted was excellent.
