I just spoke with your office in Maryland and was instructed to write the following request to obtain information that, under normal circumstances, would be available for public viewing at your reading room in Maryland. I was told that this information is no longer available for public viewing after the Sept. 11 disaster, but could be obtained through the Freedom of Information Act.

We represent Attorney Michael Paul in a Legal Malpractice Action arising from an underlying action and accident at the Salem Nuclear Power Plant in 1987.

After exhaustive research, we have been unable to locate any drawings, photographs, etc. of the airlock door and hand wheel which leads into the containment unit.

The plaintiff in this case Ella Riley Turley was a painter for an outside contractor, tagging items to be painted. She was in a stooped position, placed both hands on the hand wheel attached to the airlock door and claims that the wheel came off, hitting her in the head and back.

Please accept this email as my request through the Freedom of Information Act to obtain any drawings, photographs, maintenance manuals and/or descriptions of the above mentioned airlock door and hand wheel.
