Dear NRC, I'm a child of a former Russian nuclear engineer (now retired). My mother worked for Stone & Webster in the US, building nuclear plants. In USSR, she worked for Latvian Academy of Sciences. USSR never had any regulatory restrictions on nuclear waste, thus, soil, metals and other materials were recycled in public use as a matter of course. The result of it was mass sterility and impotence in ment (Saratov, Kazakhstan, Krasnoyarsk), as well as birth defects in children born to women. The three sites mentioned as the ones my mom knew about, there are many more. In the city of Moscow a leak from a nuclear plant created specific birth defect in children - they were all born missing one hand. This was covered by our National Geographic magazine. There are pockets in Moscow outskirts where male impotence is rampant. This is what you are going to see in ten years. These are your sons you are going to rob of sexuality and normal life. There's enough proof gathered around the world to show that these issues are quite serious. What are you going to tell your handicapped grandchildren - that the money was more important????
