

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION COLLECTION REQUEST

Title: 10 CFR Part 110, Export and Import of Nuclear Equipment and Material

Current Burden/Responses: 285 hours/225 responses

Proposed Burden/Responses: 316 hours/254 responses (144 Recordkeepers)

Frequency of Response: On occasion

Number of Respondents: 144

Reasons for Changes in Burden/Responses: The overall burden increased by 31 hours from 285 to 316 hours.

Recordkeeping Burden - Increased by 23 hours from 150 to 173 hours

- the addition of 6 recordkeepers, at a burden of 7 hours, which were inadvertently omitted from the change worksheet that implemented the Final Rule, "Export and Import of Nuclear Equipment and Material," approved by OMB on 12/01/2000;
- the addition of 4 recordkeepers at an increased burden of 4.8 hours for specific licenses to import major components (10 CFR 110.53(b)) which were omitted from the previous clearance;
- the staff re-estimated the number of recordkeepers based on the actual number of recordkeepers during the current 3 year clearance, resulting in an increase of 9 recordkeepers from 135 to 144, with a resulting burden increase of 11 hours.

Reporting Burden - increased by 8 hours from 135 to 143 hours

- the addition of the reporting requirement at 10 CFR 110.31(a-e) that was omitted from the prior clearance increased the number of responses by 4 and the burden by 8 hours.

The change in cost reflects an increase in the annual labor cost for reactor and materials licensees from \$140 to \$154 per hour.

Abstract: 10 CFR 110 provides application, reporting, and recordkeeping requirements for export and imports of nuclear material and equipment subject to the requirements of a specific license or a general license and exports of incidental radioactive material. The information collected and maintained pursuant to 10 CFR Part 110 enables the NRC to authorize only imports and exports which are not inimical to U.S. common defense and security and which meet applicable statutory, regulatory, and policy requirements.
